


Figure A.3. Start of the intelligibility task.




Figure A.4. Intelligibility task: instructions.




Figure A.5. Intelligibility task: practice trial.




Figure A.6. Intelligibility task: teaching "confirmation" buttons.




Figure A.7. Intelligibility task: practice trial complete.




Figure A.8. Intelligibility task: example of experimental trial.




Figure A.9. Intelligibility task: confirmation of answer.




Figure A.12. Verbal-guise task: listening to stimuli I.




Figure A.13. Verbal-guise task: question for practice trial.




Figure A.14. Verbal-guise task: confirmation of answer I.




Figure A.15. Verbal-guise task: practice trial complete.




Figure A.16. Verbal-guise task: listening to stimuli II.




Figure A.17. Verbal-guise task: start of experimental trials.




Figure A.18. Verbal-guise task: listening to stimuli III.




Figure A.19. Verbal-guise task: example of experimental trial.




Figure A.20. Verbal-guise task: confirmation of answer II.




Figure A.21. Verbal-guise task: end of task.




Figure A.23. Categorization task: practice trial.




Figure A.24. Categorization task: confirmation of groups I (practice).




Figure A.25. Categorization task: confirmation of groups II (practice).




Figure A.26. Categorization task: confirmation of answer I.




Figure A.27. Categorization task: practice trial complete.




Figure A.28. Categorization task: experimental trial.




Figure A.29. Categorization task: confirmation of groups I.




Figure A.30. Categorization task: confirmation of groups II.




Figure A.31. Categorization task: confirmation of answer II.




Figure A.33. British Picture Vocabulary Scale.




Figure A.34. End of the battery of tasks for the child.
