Abstract: With the increase in digitized cultural heritage and cultural and social interaction taking place on digital platforms, humanistic research is increasingly oriented towards digitized and native digital research objects. Consequently new research questions arise, and new research methods and new - digitally based - research tools develop. In a Danish context DigHumLab as a national research infrastructures has as its mission to support this movement towards digitally based humanities research. The infrastructure is a joint venture between the humanities faculties in Denmark and is funded until 2017 through a state grant. As an umbrella for research development DigHumLab should help to develop technological solutions that guarantee access to data and tools and, finally, offer advice and skills development. In addition, the infrastructure serves as the national hub for, on the one hand, the European research infrastructures DARIAH and CLARIN, and on the other side, Nordic units for digitally-based research. The presentation will introduce DIGHUMLAB's vision and mission and will open a discussion concerning opportunities to develop and introduce digital tools for humanities researchers.
